President's Message - Aimee Bendotti

On Behalf of the 2025 Warren Districts Agricultural Society committee, I would like to welcome everyone to our Annual Show. Our dedicated committee have worked tirelessly throughout the year, they have been fundraising and putting together ideas for this year's show and I'd like to thank them very much for their efforts.

This year we are focusing on Avocadoes. The Avocado industry, although a relatively new industry, first started in the mid to late 80's in the Pemberton area. The Avocado industry in the Southern Forest Region has quickly established itself as a leader in Australian production of avocados.

Producers in the region predominately grow Hass avocados, with many national and international markets. In 2021-2023 seasons on average WA produced the second largest number of avocados in Australia with 34100tn behind QLD with 36400tn.

Each year we try to offer something for everyone within the community and Avogood feeling that this year's show will be no different.

We have all the usual show favourites, Poultry Pavilion, Cattle Displays, Show Jumping, Show and Breed Horses, Goat Displays, Cavies Displays, Dog Show Jumping, Log Chops, Sideshow Alley, Helicopter Rides, Live music and performances throughout the day.

SHOW REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS

All entries are subject to the Show Regulations and By-laws, the Special Regulations, and to the Uniform By-laws made under the Royal Agricultural Society Shows Act, 1962.

ENTRY FORMS

- Relevant forms in schedule book or on website must be completed and forwarded with the correct entry fees. www.warrenagsociety.com.au.
- ✤ Forms close with the Secretary, 5pm on Monday 10th March.
- Late entry forms will not be accepted for any sections.

EXHIBITS

- Exhibits must be ready for judging as stipulated by each Section.
- Late exhibits will not be judged.
- Every exhibit must be grown by or be the work of the exhibitor and an exhibitor may be called upon to make an affidavit to that effect.
- Exhibitors or their agents, when called upon by the stewards of the society, shall prove the correctness of their entries.
- No exhibit may compete in more than one class, except in special group classes and with the exception of ring events.
- Exhibition Hall will be open for public viewing on Friday from 4pm and Saturday 9am to 3pm
- Exhibits must remain in place until 3pm on Saturday 15th March. After 4pm, exhibits are the sole responsibility of the exhibitor or owner.
- The Society will be under no liability to any exhibitor for any loss or damage of their exhibit, whether caused by or attributed to the negligence of the Society or any of its servants.

Exhibits not removed within one month will become the property of the Society.
 STOCK EXHIBITS

- All animals entering the show must be earmarked and / or branded and identified with a NLIS Electronic device and be accompanied by a weigh bill.
- All animals must be BVDV tested free
- All animals must be at the showgrounds prior to 8.45am on Saturday and can leave after the Grand Parade.
- Animals must be free from disease & parasites to be accepted for judging
- No dogs are permitted on the showgrounds with exception of 'seeing eye dogs' or dogs entered in the dog Show Jumping competition. Show Jump dogs to be removed from the grounds after the competition. These dogs are to be kept on a leash and always cared for by owner whilst on the grounds.

PRIZE MONEY / POINTS

- Winning prize money is to be collected from the Show Office on Saturday 15th March. All prizes not claimed one month after the show shall be forfeited to the funds of the Society.
- Champion Ribbon: Red, White and Blue. First Prize Blue; Second Prize
 Red; Third Prize White.
- Certificates awarded to all prize winning exhibits and where deserving, in the judges opinion, Special Certificates of Merit.
- Points allocation is 1st Place three points; 2nd Place two points; 3rd Place – one point.

SECTION B – EQUESTRIAN INFORMATION

Society's Liability: All person's entering the equestrian section do so at their own risk. The committee, steward, judges, helpers, etc. will not be liable in any way for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horses/ponies, owners, handlers or spectators. Please ensure you have the relevant insurance to ensure the safety of animal and human.

- All competitors and exhibitors must purchase Admission to the show online via www.trybooking.com or cash or card at the gate. Entry bands will be issued at the gate and must be worn at all times.
- Gates at Johnson Street will be open for entry to the grounds from 6:00am Saturday 15th March 2025
- > No horses are to enter through the pedestrian entrance gates.
- > Prizes may be cash or goods to a similar value.
- All horses and ponies must be registered with their breed society. A copy of registration must accompany the entry or it will not be accepted (TB, SB and unregistered are exempt).
- Horses or ponies that are multi registered may compete in all eligible classes but remember classes will not be held up at any time, if classes clash competitors must choose 1 ring.
- Entry in to Any Other Registered Breed is <u>only if the registration is not covered in</u> any of the other classes listed in the schedule.
- Stallions and Colts must be under control <u>at all times</u>. They must be wearing suitable and substantial head gear. The age of the handler must be as per each respective Breed Society regulation. Notwithstanding this, handlers may not be younger than 18 years for in hand classes.
- Age of the rider and handler will be as at the day of the event. Proof of age may be requested.
- All riders must wear a current approved safety helmet and riding boots at all times whilst mounted on their horse or pony.
- All handlers must wear safe enclosed footwear and appropriate attire in accordance with Breed Society Regulation.
- Any whip used must adhere to each Breed Society regulation. Notwithstanding this, whip length MUST NOT exceed 120cm.

- It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure they are ringside in time to compete in their class. If classes clash it is the responsibility of the competitor to choose which event they will compete in. Classes will not be held up.
- Refunds (less administration costs) will <u>only be made</u> on production of a Medical or Veterinary Certificate. A copy of the certificate must be supplied to the Organising Committee within 5 days of the event.
- The decision of the Judge is final. Poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Failure to abide by this and any of our other rules may lead to disqualification and forfeiture of entry fees.
- All breed exhibits will aim to be judged in accordance with the standards of the relevant breed association.
- The organisers reserve the right to cancel, alter, delete or combine any events they deem necessary <u>on the day.</u>
- If a Judge or the Show Committee deems an Exhibit to be unruly (or unwell) it will be required to leave the grounds. This rule is in the interest of the safety of all competitors, spectators and officials and must be abided by.
- > Where one ring finishes early, classes may be moved to another ring;
- All riders less than 18 years of age must always wear approved safety helmets. All riders aged 18 years and over may choose not to wear a helmet if they have signed the appropriate waiver, otherwise they must wear approved safety helmets.
- Any protest must be made within half hour of the end of the class, in writing to the Event Coordinator on grounds, accompanied by a \$50.00 cash deposit (non-refundable if the protest is not upheld). Rulings will endeavor to be provided within half hour of the presentation of Supreme Champion Exhibit.
- Exhibitors, owners or spectators are not to approach any Judge without prior approval from the Event Coordinator.
- Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded within each breed section and the Champion will be eligible for Supreme Champion Exhibit. Horses that are placed second to the Champion will be eligible for judging of Reserve Champion. Best Presented, Handler and Unregistered classes are ineligible for Supreme.
- Please ensure you leave the area in which you parked your vehicle/float/truck and attended your horse/pony in the state in which you found it. Manure MUST be removed by you and no hay is to be left behind.

- > All entries must endeavor to participate in the Grand Parade Saturday 1pm
- Entries and fees for Show and unofficial show jumping are due on the day. Cash only.
- Breed Entries will be taken online via NOMINATE. Entries close Sunday 9th March at 5pm. On the day entries will be permitted however a \$10 late entry fee will be applied per exhibit. You must present at the Breed Hub Tent to submit on the day entries prior to 7:00am to ensure you receive your pack in time for commencement of classes.
- Competitor packs will be available at the Breed Hub tent near the entrance. Please note that this is where the Breed Coordinator will be based throughout the event.
- > If required, height Certificates should be current and available if requested.
- > All Equestrian Winners to receive a Sash
- > If you have won a sponsored class, please endeavour to thank the sponsor.
- > Please remember to thank your judge, ring officials and fellow competitors.

For the cake: 3 cups plain flour 6 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder

- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 ripe avocado mashed until very smooth
- 2 cups water
- 2 tablespoons white vinegar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 cups castor sugar

For the frosting:

- 2 large ripe avocados peeled and pitted
- 2 cups icing sugar
- 4 tablespoons cocoa powder

Instructions

Preheat oven to 180 degrees Celsius

Grease and flour a 10" round cake tin

In a large mixing bowl, whisk together flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Set aside.

In a separate bowl, whisk together the vegetable oil, avocado, water, vinegar and vanilla. Whisk until well combined.

Whisk sugar into the wet mix.

Add the wet mixture to the flour mixture all at once. Beat with a whisk (by hand) until smooth.

Pour batter into the cake pan. Bake for 45 to 55 minutes or until a toothpick inserted comes out clean.

Let cake cool in pan for 15 - 20 minutes on a cooling rack. Turn cake out onto cooling rack to cool completely before frosting.

For buttercream frosting:

Scoop avocados out into a food processor. Process until smooth, about 2 minutes, stopping to scrape down avocado with spatula if necessary.

Add icing sugar and cocoa powder to pureed avocado. Process for another minute or until creamy and combined, stopping once to scrape down mixture if necessary.

Frost cake. Let cake sit a few hours before serving, allowing time for flavours to blend.

- Run up area and landing area is to be flat with a platform land.
- The dog is to jump over the wall; however the dog can touch any part of the jump to get over the wall.
- The dogs can be encouraged over the jump by a handler vocally or visually. The handler must not touch the wall at any time.
- ✤ A second handler may be used to catch the dog on the other side of the jump.
- ✤ All dogs to jump at each height. First jump height 1m.
- Each dog is allowed three jump attempts at each height if necessary until only one dog remains to provide a winner.
- If more than one dog has jumped the final height, a count back on refusals is to be done to find a winner. If all are equal the prize is shared with each dog declared winners



Warren District Ag Society Cavies Show Schedule

Welcome to the Warren District Ag Society Cavies Pedigree and Pet Cavy Show. Please follow the schedule below to enter your cavies. Each specific class is based on cavy type and genetics.

<u>AGOUTI</u>

Agouti cavies are characterised by a distinct 'ticking' pattern, where each hair alternates between bands of two colours. The Agouti pattern is determined by the dominant Agouti gene (A). These cavies do not carry genes for long hair, satan, or markings. Examples include White Black Agouti, Red Lilac Agouti, White Chocolate Agouti, Cream Slate Agouti etc.

MONOCHROME / Self

Self Cavies are solid coloured throughout their body, controlled by the non-agouti allele (aa). They do not carry genes for long hair, crests or satin. Examples include Self Black, Self Lilac, Self White (DEW and PEW).

<u>CRESTED</u>

Crested cavies have a distinct rosette on their forehead caused by the dominant gene (C). This group includes a Monochrome Crested (solid colours) and Crested Any Other Variety (marked or agouti cavies with a crest). Examples include Black Crested, White Black Agouti Crested and Dutch Crested.

HAIRLESS

Hairless cavies lack fur due to a recessive mutation (hr) with minimal fur on the nose and feet. Examples include Australian Hairless Cavy, Skinny Pig and Baldwin Cavy.

MULTI-CHROME / Marked

Marked cavies have two or more distinct colour patches, controlled by the S locus. Examples include Bi-Colour, Tri-Colour, Brindle, Dutch and Himalayan.

<u>ROSETTE</u>

Rosetted cavies have multiple circular hair whorls, controlled by the dominant gene (R). Examples include Abyssinian (8-10 rosettes) and Ridgeback (a single ridge along the back).

<u>TEXTURED</u>

Textured cavies have unique coat types, such as dense or springy fur, controlled by dominant genes. Examples include Rex (short, springy coat), Teddy (soft plush coat), and Curly Rex (wavy fur).

LONG HAIR

Long-haired cavies carry a recessive gene (I) that leads to continuous hair growth. Examples include Peruvian (long flowing hair), Silkie, Texel (long curls), Coronet (long hair with crest), and Alpaca (wavy long hair).

<u>SATIN</u>

Satin cavies have a shiny coat due to a recessive mutation in the Satan gene. However they are prone to osteodystrophy, a genetic bone disease. Due to these health concerns, Satin cavies are excluded from Pedigree shows but may be shown in Pet Classes. Examples include Satin Black, Satin Lilac.
